- I am determined to bring good quality jobs and prosperity to Ynys Môn which is why I have championed:
- The £2.7m Community Renewal **Fund:** which helped local businesses create around 90 new employment opportunities.
- Anglesey Freeport: jobs have already been created to manage the programme and transform the old Anglesey Aluminium site into Prosperity Parc. The Freeport itself is forecast to generate up to 13,000 jobs across North Wales with at least 1,000 on Anglesey.
- The £17m Levelling Up Fund: local people are being employed to revive Holyhead Town Centre with 65 long term permanent jobs expected when the work is complete.
- The £16.1m Shared Prosperity Fund: supporting 25 levelling up projects across Anglesey with £400k specifically for Ynys Môn sports clubs and voluntary organisations.
- New nuclear at Wylfa: the UK Government is in discussions to buy the site from Hitachi. Wylfa has the potential to create 9,000 construction jobs and 900 long-term jobs.

We need this investment to enable local people to stay here on Ynys Môn, raise their families and protect our Welsh language.

That is why I created my 'Local Jobs for Local People' campaign.

I visit businesses all over the island and you will regularly see me showing companies around that are interested in investing on Ynys Môn. I ask these businesses to publicly commit to training and employing local people whenever possible by signing up to my campaign. Many local, national and global companies have already signed up.

In doing so they are recognising the importance of our local language and culture, our need for long term economic stability and local people's passion to stay on the island and live and work here.

Local Opportunities

Last year the UK Government pledged £17m from its have signed up to my Local Jobs for Local People Levelling Up Fund for a culture and heritage driven transformation of Holyhead.

The town centre is now starting to see this money in action. St Cybi's Church is being refurbished to create a more community-accessible space with plans for Eglwys y Bedd to become a social enterprise café.

The Ucheldre Centre is being extended to provide more opportunities for local people to take part in the creative arts. The Newry shelters are being refurbished and will become homes for local businesses Island Bakes, Môn Ice, Cuffed-in Coffee and Anglesey Hamper Company. All four

Large empty town centre buildings including the former Careers Company offices in Market Square and the old Midland Bank will undergo transformation to accommodate new and expanding local businesses.

I sponsored and supported the Levelling Up Fund bid because providing local jobs for local people is at its very heart. The programme of work will transform Holyhead back into a productive and prosperous town centre with more jobs and opportunities for islanders and I am proud of the achievements of the team working on it.

Creating employment opportunities is just one part of the jigsaw. It is also important to help people access jobs and help local businesses take advantage of new supply chain opportunities.

That is why I have worked with the local Jobs Centres team to run four Jobs Fairs on Ynys Môn and with the Anglesey Freeport team to deliver six Freeport Seminars across the island.

With up to 25 companies represented at each, my Jobs Fairs have been attended by hundreds of local people. We have focused on people who traditionally face challenges accessing employment including the over 50s and those with disabilities.
